What is the Family Advocacy Program?

The Family Advocacy Program (FAP) of Syracuse is a medical-legal partnership between the University Pediatric and Adolescent Center (UPAC) of University Hospital of SUNY Upstate Medical University and the Children's Rights and Family Law Clinic (Clinic) and Family Law and Social Policy Center (Center) of Syracuse University College of Law. FAP provides comprehensive legal advocacy to UPAC patients and families to resolve the health-related legal needs of low-income children. The Clinic and the Center develop and administer training to UPAC staff to assist them in identifying children and families in need of FAP services. UPAC then refers those families to FAP legal staff at the Clinic where they receive free legal assistance. If the Clinic is unable to provide legal assistance due to a conflict or lack of resources, the case is referred to the Center's pro bono program for placement with a volunteer attorney.
