This 1.5-credit CLE discusses how pro bono attorneys can engage *on a grassroots level* to help create pathways out of poverty.

Syracuse recently made national headlines for having the highest rate of extreme poverty concentrated among blacks and Hispanics out of 100 largest metropolitan areas in the United States. Syracuse's poverty rate is 33.2% (more than twice the New York State average), and nearly two-thirds (66.2%) of black and Hispanics who live in Syracuse live in poverty, and are concentrated within 30 census tracts, which make up approximately half of the city's geographic area. CNY's Upstate Revitalization Initiative application states, "Poverty rates and social inequality prevent the region from realizing its full economic potential. Residents of inner-city neighborhoods, rural communities, and, increasingly, inner-ring suburbs struggle to access jobs and build wealth. This is evidenced by the chilling statistic that 44 percent of Central New York's population is living at or near the poverty line." These statistics are overwhelming and leave us wondering how we can be part of the process of lifting our community out of poverty and generating economic development for our entire region.
