## Important Developments in the Clean Water Act:

### The Navigable Waters Protection Rule and County of Maui v. Hawaii Wildlife Fund

There are two recent major developments relating to the regulation of wetlands under the Clean Water Act. First, the Army Corps of Engineers and the Environmental Protection Agency published the Navigable Waters Protection Rule which more narrowly defines the scope of what is considered a wetland, provides clear exclusions for many water features that traditionally have not been regulated, and defines terms in the regulatory text that have never been defined before. Second, the United States Supreme Court decided *County of Maui v. Hawaii Wildlife Fund*. In that case, the Court held that a County-run wastewater treatment facility was violating the Clean Water Act where it was discharging pollutants into groundwater that ultimately reached the ocean and in so holding created the "functional equivalency" test for determining when discharges to groundwater are regulated by the Clean Water Act. We will discuss the impact of these developments on the regulated community and project development.
